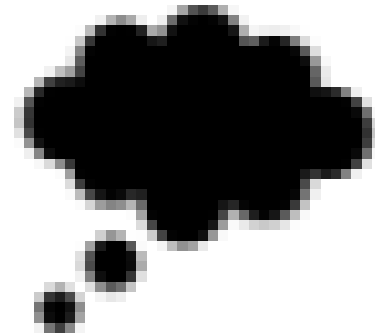

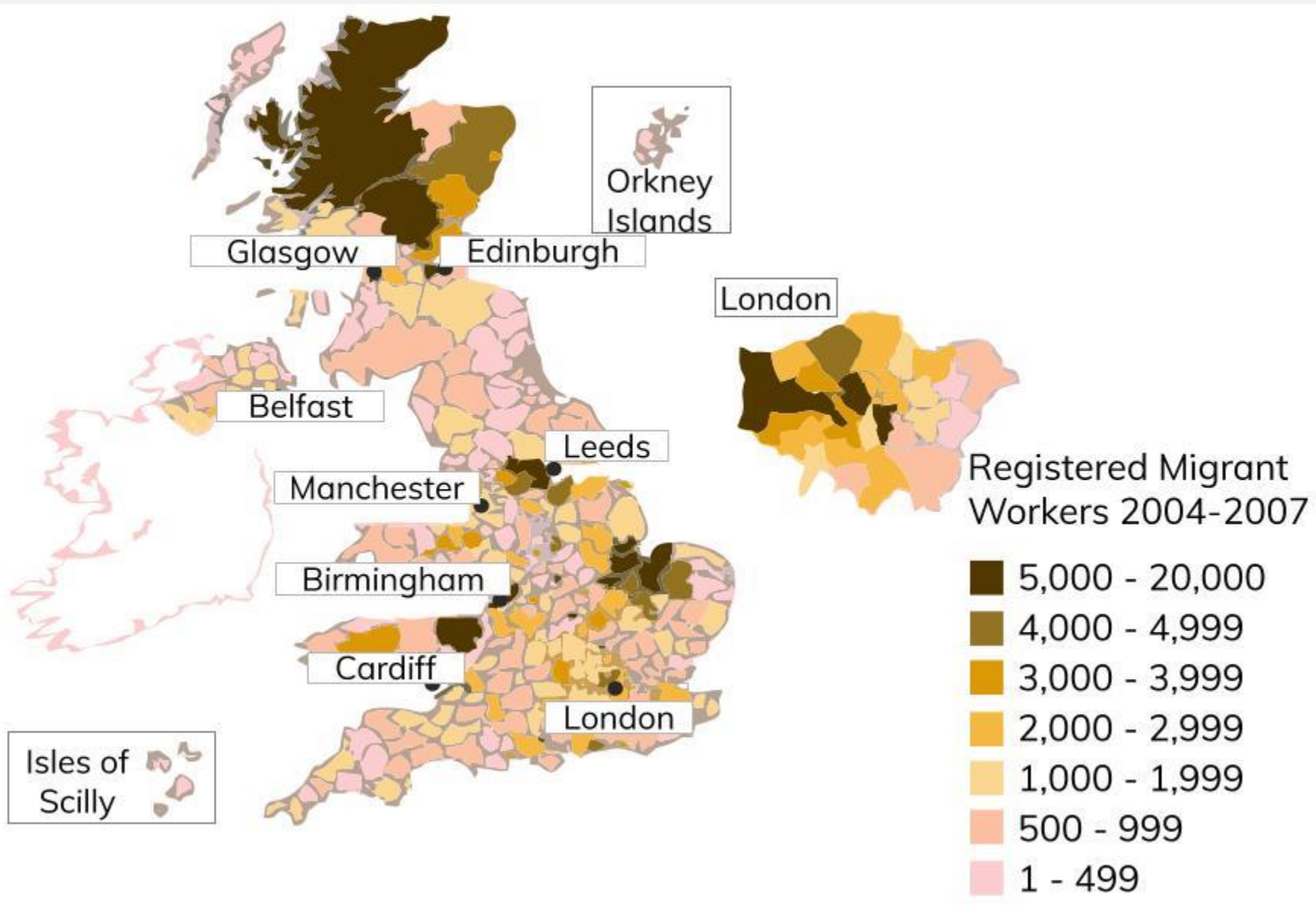

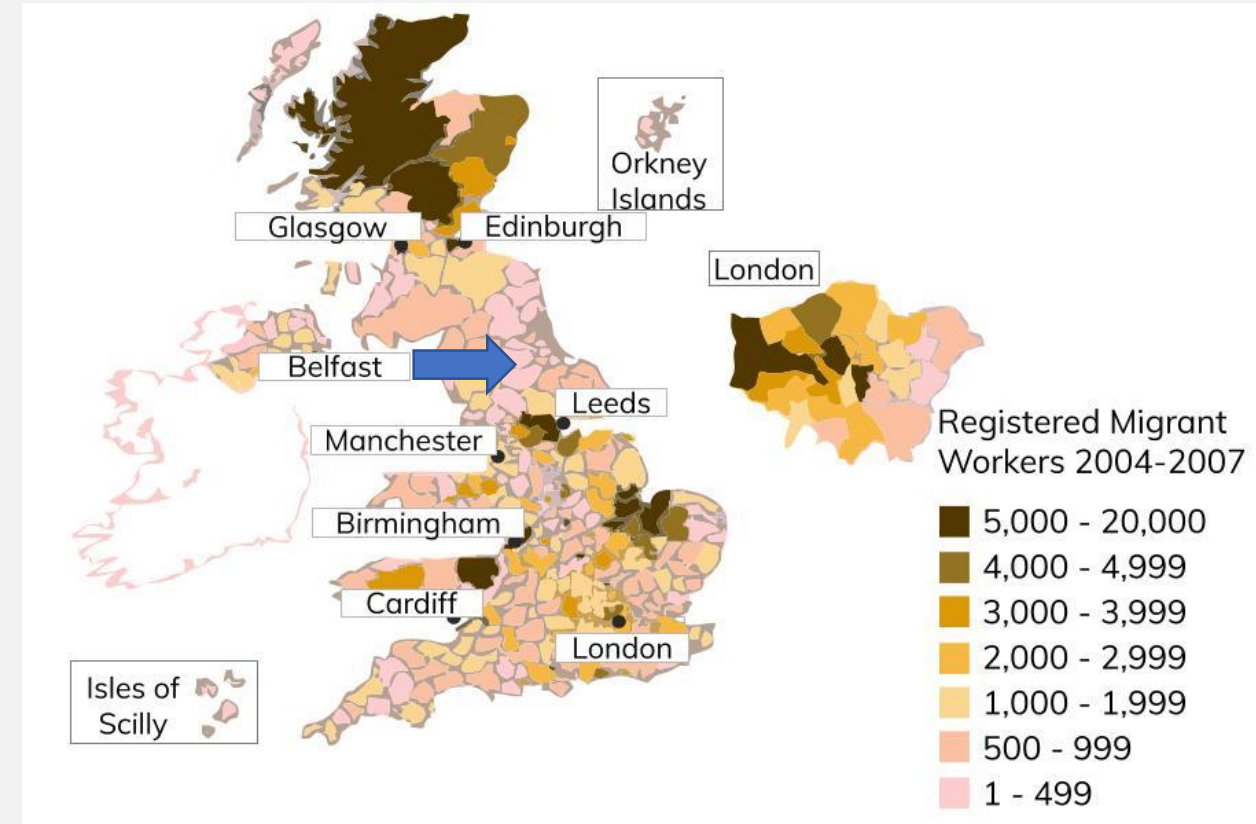
a. Which part of the country is home to the greatest number of economic migrants?

b. Circle an area of the country with fewer than 500 migrants. **See arrow for one example.**

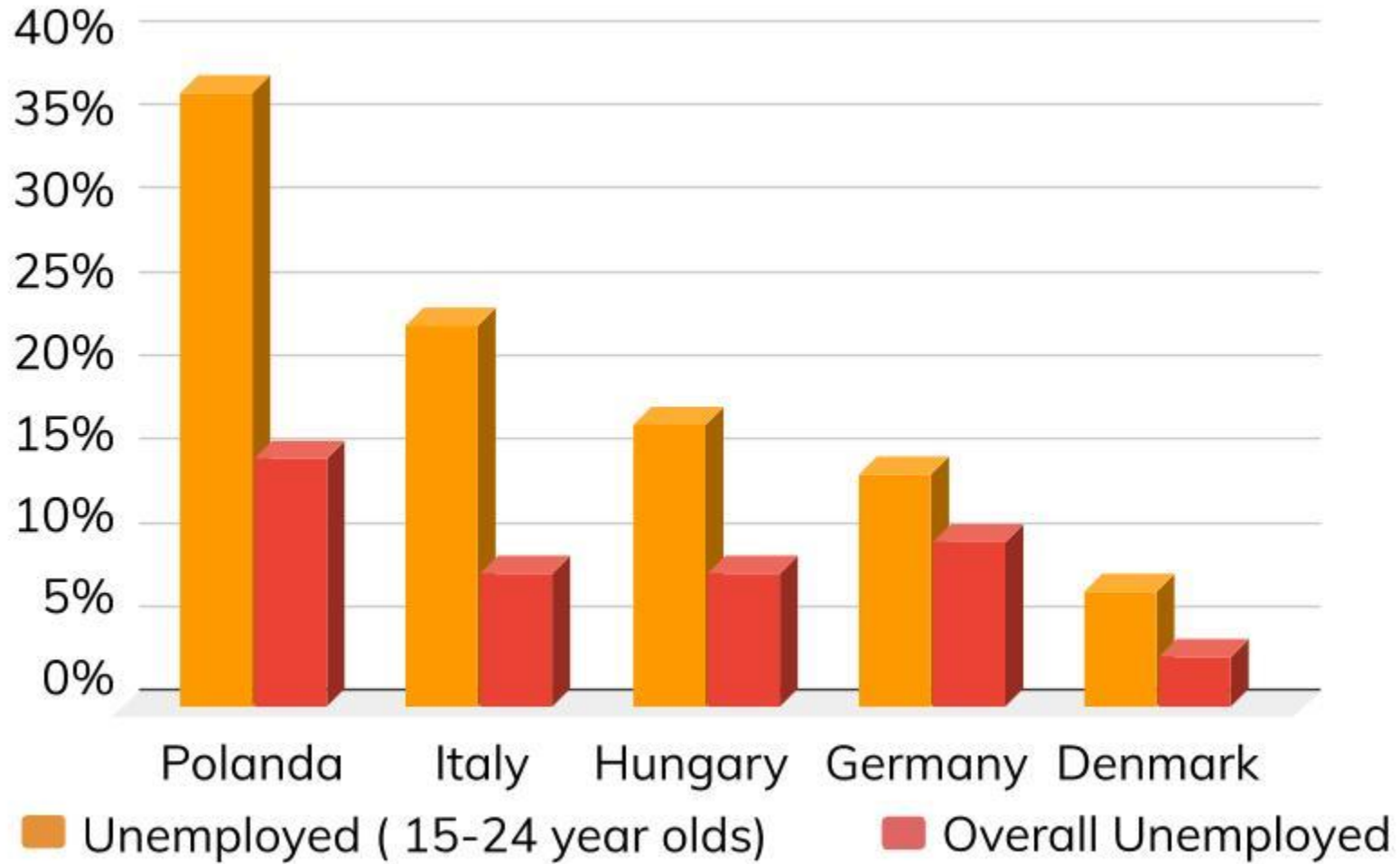
