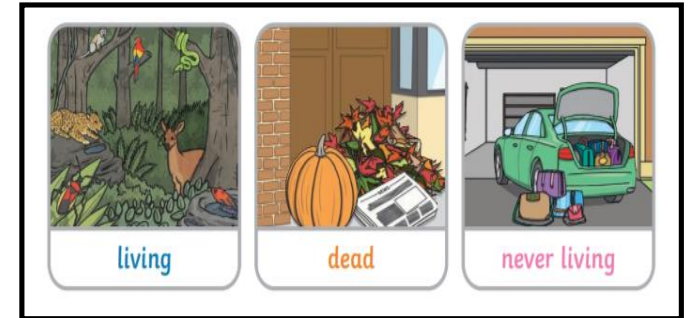
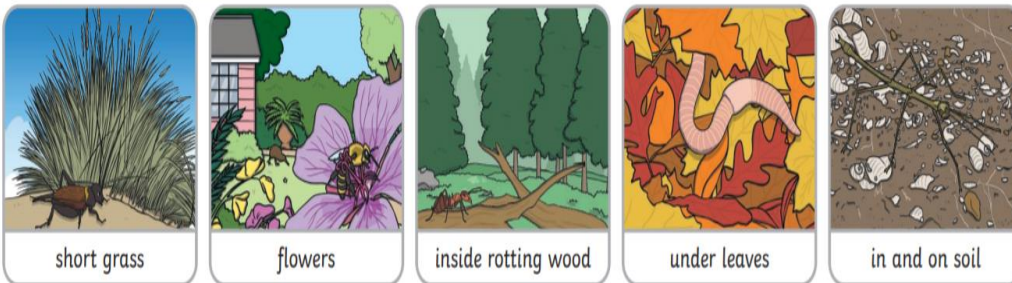


Habitat	The natural place where something lives, providing everything they need to survive.
Micro-habitat	A very small habitat, such as under a log or a rock.
Adaptation	How a living thing can change over time to make sure it survives in a certain habitat.
Carnivore	A meat-eating animal.
Herbivore	A plant-eating animal.
Omnivore	An animal that eats meat and plants.
Predator	An animal that hunt, kills and eats other animals for food.
Prey	An animal that is hunted by a predator.
Food-Chain	The order in which living things depend on each other for food.
Producer	Something that makes its own food (such as a plant)
Consumer	Living things that eat something else for energy.

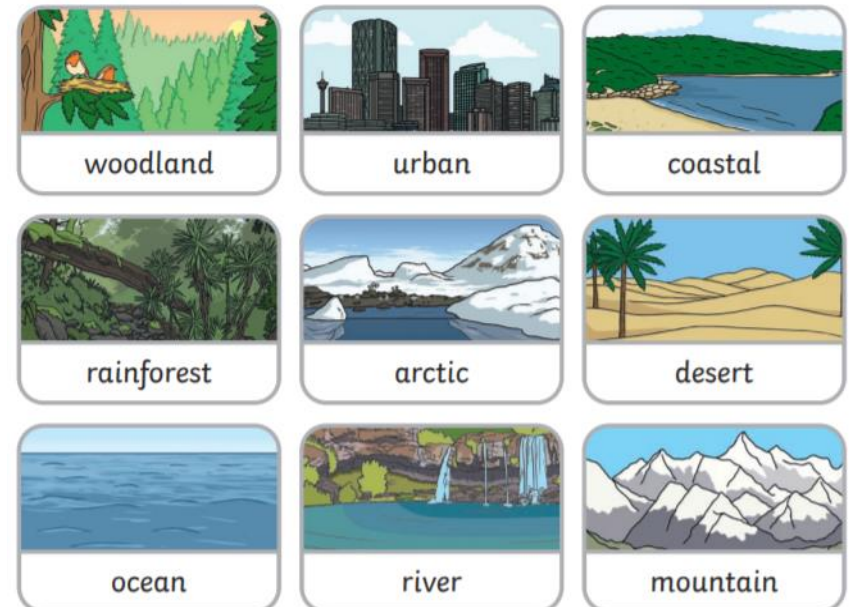
