

Stone Age Britain (Pre 43AD) - Year 2 - Summer 1

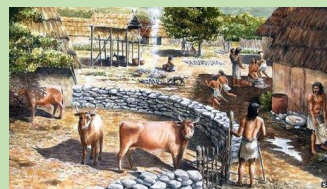
Homes were becoming more **permanent**. They were built using **wattle and daub**. Homes were **open plan**, they had a fire, bed, shelves and animal skins on the walls.



During the **winter** people would wear clothes made from **animal skins**. In the **summer** people would wear clothes made from **grass and plants**. They **didn't wear shoes** because there were no pavements or roads.



At the **beginning** of the stone age people would **hunt for meat, and gather nuts and berries**. Later on, people began **farming**. They would **grow their own crops and keep their own animals**.



Permanent	Lasting for a long time/forever.
Construct	Building or making something.
Available	Able to be used.
Suitable	Right and appropriate for a person or situation.
Provide	Giving.
Hunt	Killing animals to eat.
Farming	Growing crops and raising animals for food.
Trial and error	Trying different things until something works.
Remedies	A treatment for an illness.
Tools	A device used to make a job easier.
Export	Sending goods to another country to be sold.
Control	Deciding what will happen.

In Stone Age Britain people believed **God's controlled their health**. They didn't know much about the body so had a **trial and error approach**. They used **plants as medicine**.



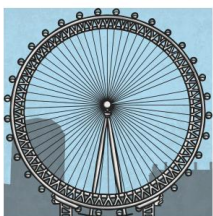
The majority of people would **have travelled by foot**. The **first boats** were built by removing the middle of a tree trunk. People also began making simple **wooden wheels**.

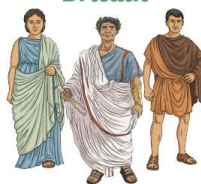
