

Year 6 Curriculum – Spring 2



This term's Maths curriculum consolidates converting units of measurement, Area and Volume, perimeter and ratio. It continues to challenge and extend them through reasoning style questions and continue Arithmetic practice.



This term the children will experience a literacy short animation called 'Alma'. From this, they will create a formal police report, and a narrative using a range of literacy features such as pathetic fallacy, thematic language and varying sentence types for effect.



The Science curriculum this term focuses on forms of energy. The children will continue working scientifically to explore different energy types.

Computing this year will focus on understanding basic programming using python and being safe online. It also looks at how to navigate and adapt apps.



The religion focus this term will be Christianity . There will be a theme regarding beliefs and practices.

The Key Question throughout the term: Is Christianity still a strong religion 2000 years after Jesus was on Earth?







Geography this year will focus on map skills and using atlases accurately, looking at the differences between modern Europe, non-European countries and the UK, as well as economic activity and natural resources.



PSHE is covered weekly in class through our scheme Jigsaw, where the children focus on ' Healthy me'. This term children will reflect on a range of healthy and safe practices in their day-today lives.

Creative arts and design this term will focus on 'having your own voice'. Children will research and replicate a variety of artists use of mixed media and create their own piece which they can explain their choices and the deeper meaning of their art.



Year 6 will start this term with Tennis and Football, offering children a variation in team and independent sports, utilising dexterity, agility and approach during match play. PE days Tuesday and Friday
